Inside, we saw this reminder posted on the classroom door for drop off (right) and

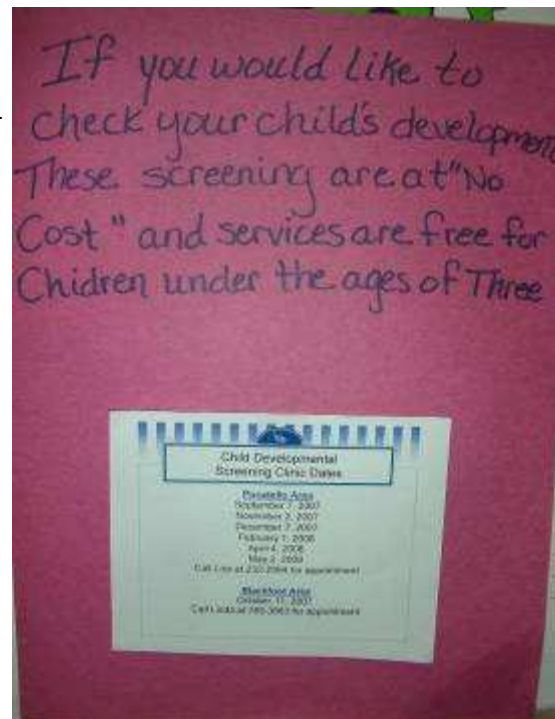


(below) a good example of facilitating parent to parent communication. Parents are encouraged to invite and inform other parents.
