#### **MISSION:**

The Coeur d' Alene Early Learning Advisory Committee (CDA ELAC) exists to support statewide efforts to elevate and unify local early childhood systems. The ELAC will work to analyze and build upon current early learning systems to maximize equitable access to a variety of quality programming and share developmentally appropriate practices and resources with the goal of improving school readiness and overall well-being of children and families.

#### VALUES:

- Parents identified key areas of development from the National Association from the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) as skills that are important for children for school readiness

-Parents identified they were attending mixed delivery options for types of care -Parents access information for resources, where to find care, etc in a variety of platforms. 47.7% were somewhat sure or were not sure where to find information.
